## FRENCH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (FSL)

## **Background**

The Division believes that, whenever feasible, opportunities will be provided for all students to learn French by making available French Second Language (FSL) courses.

## **Procedures**

- 1. FSL courses will be provided in all schools for students in Grades 4 through 6.
- 2. FSL will be optional to students Grades 7 through 12.
- 3. FSL must be presented to students as a choice on their option forms every year. If numbers warrant and qualified staff are available, the course offering will be provided. Combination classes should also be considered.
- 4. This programming option will be reviewed every year by school administration and Division Office staff to ensure that student needs and requests are being considered.
- 5. In accordance with the recommendations outlined by Alberta Education, schools are to strive for the following time allocations:
  - 5.1 90 hours per year in Grades 4 through 6;
  - 5.2 75 hours per year in Grades 7 through 9; and
  - 5.3 125 hours per course in Grades 10 through 12.
- 6. Staff responsible for the delivery of the FSL program must demonstrate a high level of oral and written proficiency, and be conversant with second language teaching knowledge and practice.
