### **Battle River School Division has:**

- Our school division is rated. high in "Education Quality", Kindergarten to Grade 12. with a score of 87.3.
  - 76.8% of BRSD students finish high school in three years.
  - 85.8% of survey respondents feel our schools are safe and caring.
  - Our drop out rate is low, with only 2.3% of students leaving school prior to graduation.

The Council of School Councils jointly prepared and submitted two resolutions to the Alberta School Councils Association last year, encouraging support for mental health programming in schools and a change to funding models that would see additional support given to rural schools.

The Board hosted a series of opportunities for community members to provide input into their Ward Review and began an online public consultation process in the fall of 2019.
